Dental Health Aide Therapy Training Program becomes a Degree program, gains financial aid eligibility and comes home to Alaska in 2017.

(Anchorage, Alaska) - June 3, 2016 -

Today, at the 2016 Dental Health Aide Therapist (DHAT) Graduation, the Alaska Native Tribal Health Consortium (ANTHC), the University of Washington MEDEX Program and Ilisagvik College announced improvements to the DHAT training program. In 2017, the program will move its academic home to Alaska as an Associate's of Applied Science Degree program through Ilisagvik College, Alaska's only Tribal College.

The DHAT Program will now award an Associate Degree as well as a certificate. The certificate represents a milestone of achievement for students, and as such marks the half-way point to degree completion. Students will now for the first time be eligible to apply for student financial aid for the training.

The DHAT first year education program will continue to be delivered in Anchorage at the ANTHC DHAT Training Center. In Fall 2017, the Training Center will move onto the Alaska Native Health Campus into the new ANTHC Health Education and Training Center. The second year clinical practicums will continue to be delivered in Bethel at the Yuut Elitnaurviat People's Learning Center.

ANTHC recognizes the valuable contribution, the <u>University of Washington (UW)</u> MEDEX Program made in assisting ANTHC to launch the DHAT Program and supporting Tribal access to dental care. Without the University of Washington willingness to host the DHAT program, the program would not have started. UW's support for the academic transition of DHAT has been a critical factor in ANTHC moving to a degree based program which directly benefits future Tribal students.
