## Summary email from 2/15/19 ANCSA Partnership Group meeting February 27, 2019

Good afternoon, ANCSA Contaminated Lands Partnership Group.

Below are some notes from the webinar to help clarify and guide those who were not in attendance:

- Introductions end at the 10:40 minute mark.
- At the 29 minute mark, I'd like to clarify that the accurate appropriation funding is \$200 million for Brownfield cleanup funding for each of fiscal years 2019-2023. Here is a great article explaining the appropriation and authorization.
- Kodiak, Anchorage, and Mat-Su Borough have recently received area-wide grants for assessment
  of contaminated sites. The <u>Municipality of Anchorage</u> received a \$300,000 Brownfield
  assessment grant, <u>Kodiak Island Borough</u> received a \$600,000 grant, and <u>Mat-Su Borough</u>
  received a \$550,000 Brownfield grant (Municipality of Anchorage, 2017; Kodiak Island Borough,
  2017; Matanuska-Susitna Borough, 2018).
- A question was asked by Derrick of Gakona if the Partnership Group could obtain a grant application copy as an example of a successful grant application. I reached out to Nicole Jones-Vogel of the MOA and she provided the attached FY17 successful application.
- For more information on the Multipurpose, Assessment, and Cleanup (MAC) brownfields grant, please see the <u>FY2019 Guidelines</u>. This is also a great resource for explanation on the other brownfields grants available.
- On page 12 of the aforementioned <u>link</u> are **free** "Proposal Writing Resources" for brownfield competitive grants. As Alaska is part of Region 10, our resources are <u>CCLR</u>. And, though not displayed on that page, the Tribal Technical Assistance to Brownfields providers are <u>KSU</u> and <u>ANTHC</u> (for Alaska) are also great resources for grant proposal writing assistance.
