

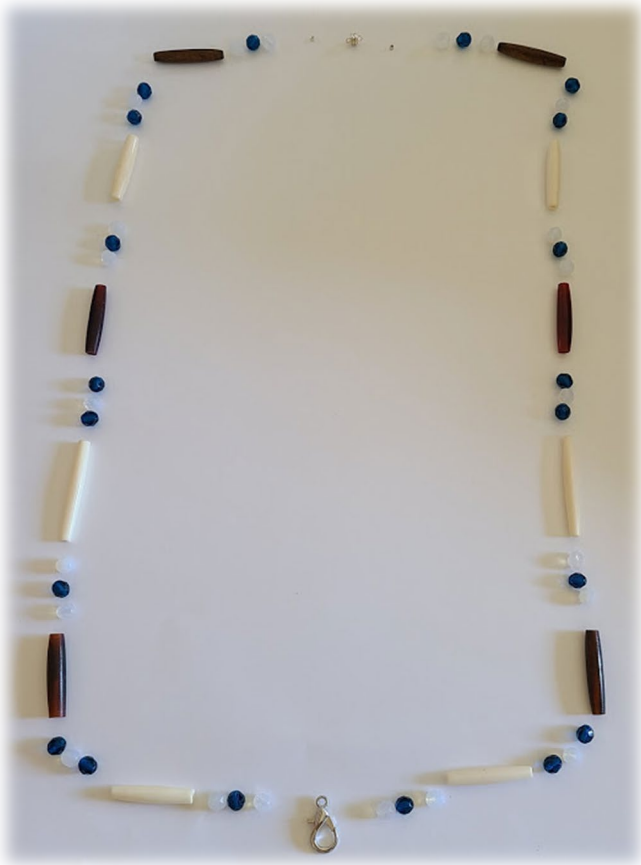


Bone Bead Lanyard

Supplies:

- 12 bone beads
- 31-42 round beads
- 1 – clip
- 2 – crimp beads
- 1 – magnet clips
- Wire cord
- Needle nose pliers





Once you have all your items out

First, Lay out the bone beads with space in between them

Second, lay out your pattern colored beads
(Like shown in the picture)



Three, take the wire cord and the clip



Four, find the middle of the cord and slide the clip on the wire



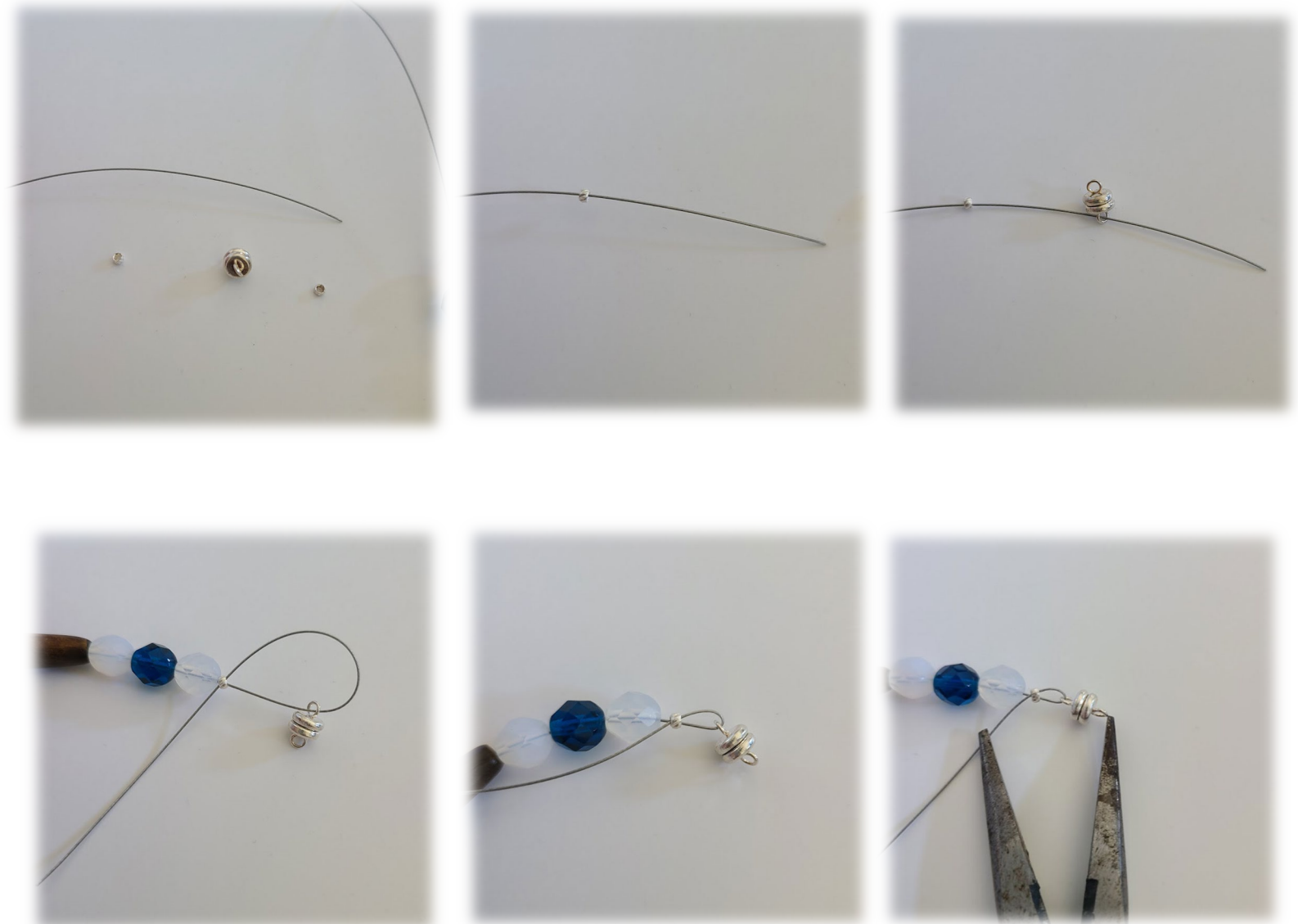
Five, take the ends of wires and pull them through the loop

Fourth, take one side of the wire and string the beads starting with the middle, where the arrow is shown

Then move to the other side of the wire and string the beads



Fifth, this is where you will need the pliers, take one of the crimper beads, slid it on the wire, then slide the magnet clip



Take the end of the wire and slide it through the crimp bead, pull the wire until the loop (shown in photo) is about $\frac{1}{2}$ cm long, take the pliers and pinch the crimp bead. (You will repeat this for the other side of the lanyard)

Don't cut the tail of the wire off, you will slide the wire down through the beads



Once it looks like shown in the photo you can cut the end of the wire, if you don't have wire cutter, scissor work to cut the wire.

(You will repeat this for the other side of the lanyard)
