



#### What is CRAFT?

Community Reinforcement and Family Training (CRAFT)

Structured Intervention (with flexibility)

Combination of CBT & MI

Reduce
Loved One's
Substance Use

Engage
Loved One into
Treatment

Improve
Family Member
Wellbeing





### **Example of CRAFT Skills**






#### The Value of CRAFT

- Family-based. Utilizes family members and aims to improve relationships
- **Positive.** Compassionate intervention, uses positive reinforcement rather than just punishment
- Culturally-congruent. Congruent with many Alaska Native values
- Another approach to try. CRAFT may work for those who have not found success with other approaches



#### CRAFT is Evidence-Based

Effective
 Intervention. 7 out of
 10 loved ones enter
 treatment



(Brigham et al., 2014; Meyers et al., 2002; Roozen et al., 2010)



#### CRAFT is Evidence-Based

- Generalizable. Effective for a multitude of relationships
   & substances
- Family member benefits. Even if loved does not enter treatment, family members experience decreases in a variety of symptoms
