

- Environmental and Climate Justice Block Grants (Sec. 60201), Environmental Protection Agency, Office of Environmental Justice and External Civil Rights, \$3 billion
  - Applications are due May 31, 2023.
- Climate Pollution Reduction Grants (Sec. 60114), Environmental Protection Agency, Office of Air and Radiation, \$5 billion:
  - Next Key Date: June 15, 2023 for applications and workplans
- Green and Resilient Retrofit Program - Grants and Loans (Sec. 30002(a)(1)), Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), \$837.5 million
  - Notice of Funding Spring 2023
- Domestic Water Supply Projects (Sec. 50231), Department of the Interior, Bureau of Reclamation, \$550 million: This program will provide domestic water supplies to disadvantaged communities or households that do not have reliable access to domestic water supplies.
  - Next Key Date: Funding announcement before the end of 2023 Bureau of Reclamation



# Food Waste Prevention Week

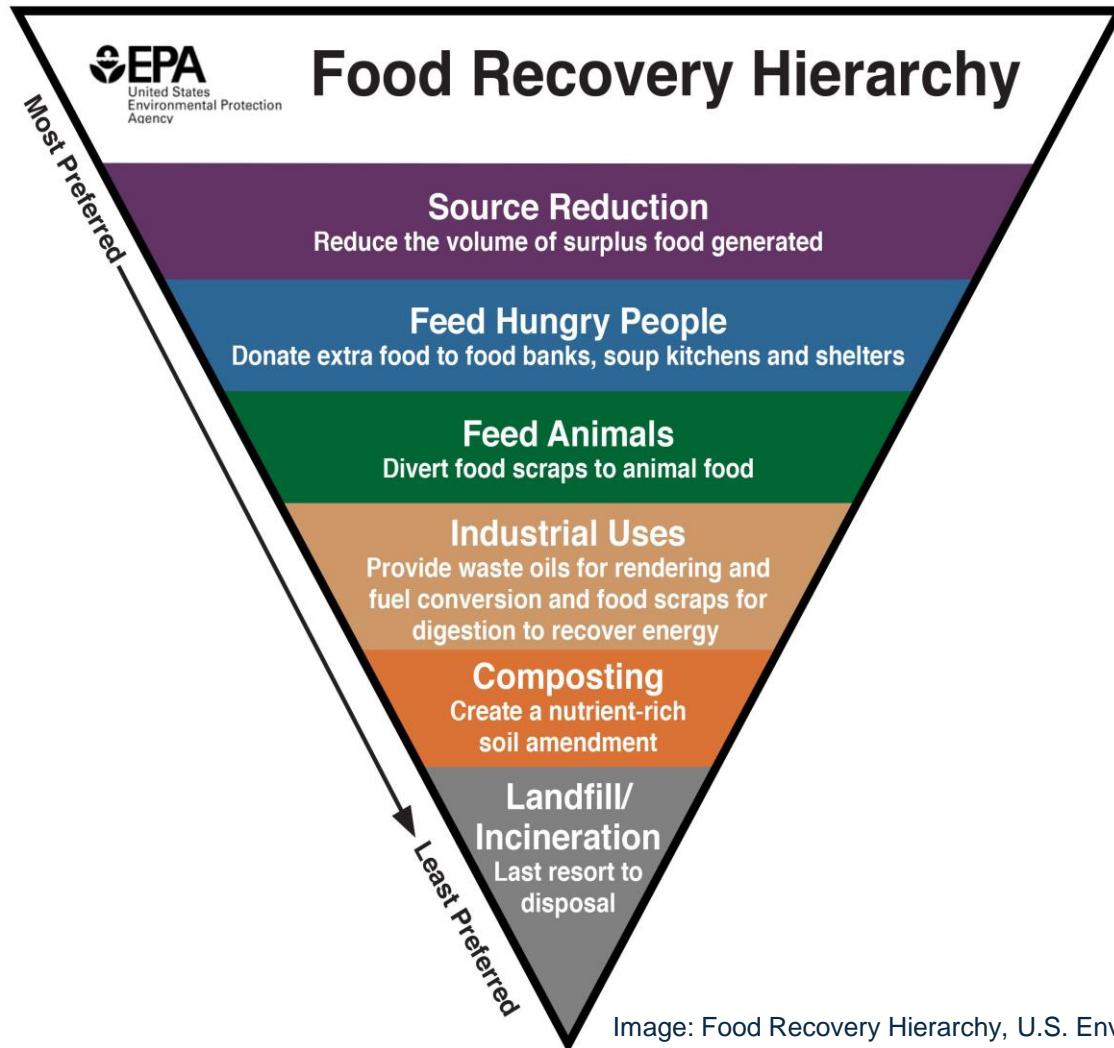


Image: Food Recovery Hierarchy, U.S. Environmental Protection Agency

# How do you reduce your food waste?

- Shop more frequently for produce
- Cook within days of shopping
- Freeze until ready to use

## Ways to PREVENT FOOD WASTE AT HOME

**FREEZE!**  
Freeze ripe fruits or veggies before they go bad



**COOK!**  
Cook only what is needed for the meal you are preparing



**SAVE!**  
Save leftovers in portion ready containers to eat later in the week



**REUSE!**  
Reuse your leftovers! This will help empty the fridge before your next shopping trip





# OUR FEATURE PRESENTATION- Lisa Daugherty



- ▶ Lisa Daugherty has been composting on a home level since 2008 and at a commercial level since 2017. She is a Master Gardener, a member of the Community Composters Coalition and the US Composting Council, and has a certificate from the Maine Compost School. She is the owner and operator of Juneau Composts, a food scrap and yard debris recycling service and soil amendment manufacturer. Juneau Composts composted nearly half a million pounds of food scraps in 2022 with a two person crew and minimal technology. Lisa strives to foster local self-reliance, divert material from the landfill, and help Juneau grow more food and flowers.
