The primary goals of this funding are to provide financial support to: • establish or enhance the four elements of an effective state or tribal response program, as specified in CERCLA Section 128(a)(2) • ensure that states and tribes maintain a public record of sites included in their programs. The funding may also be used for: • limited site assessments or cleanups at Brownfield sites, and [Note: talk to your EPA regional BF contact regarding the eligibility determinations required prior to performing site—specific work under Section 128(a).] • activities that increase the number of response actions conducted or overseen by a state or tribal response program, such as hosting brownfields awareness in communities.
